Balboa Park

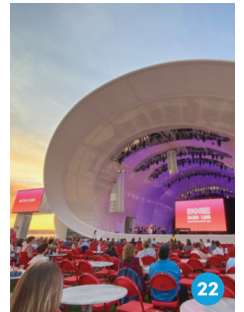
San Diego's crown jewel, the sprawling 1,200-acre park is an arts and cultural hub filled with museums, theaters, gardens and more.

Waterfront Park

Take a break in between sightseeing in Little Italy and the Embarcadero at this popular destination for kids and adults including a splash fountain, ocean views, play zone, picnic areas and more.



Rady Shell at Jacobs Park

An architectural wonder, the Rady Shell is equal parts state-of-the-art concert venue and public open space for all to enjoy. Experience musical concerts, symphony performances, private events, and a public promenade.



MLK, Jr. Promenade

Martin Luther King, Jr. Promenade is a twelve-acre park designed for people of all ages to enjoy. The 0.6-mile-long linear park begins in the Gaslamp Quarter and features public art and plaques highlighting some of Dr. King's powerful words.



Tuna Harbor Park

Originally named for its connection to the fishing industry as a tuna port, this park includes shaded areas to relax, a scenic promenade, bike routes and a perfect vantage point for watching boats in San Diego Bay.



Tweet Street Park

Located in Cortez, Tweet Street Park is a sweet retreat in this residential neighborhood. Its name was inspired by birdhouses created as part of a public art competition to attract native birds back to the neighborhood.








Downtown San Diego is divided into 7 neighborhoods. Together they make the diverse tapestry of culture, food and activities that is San Diego.
