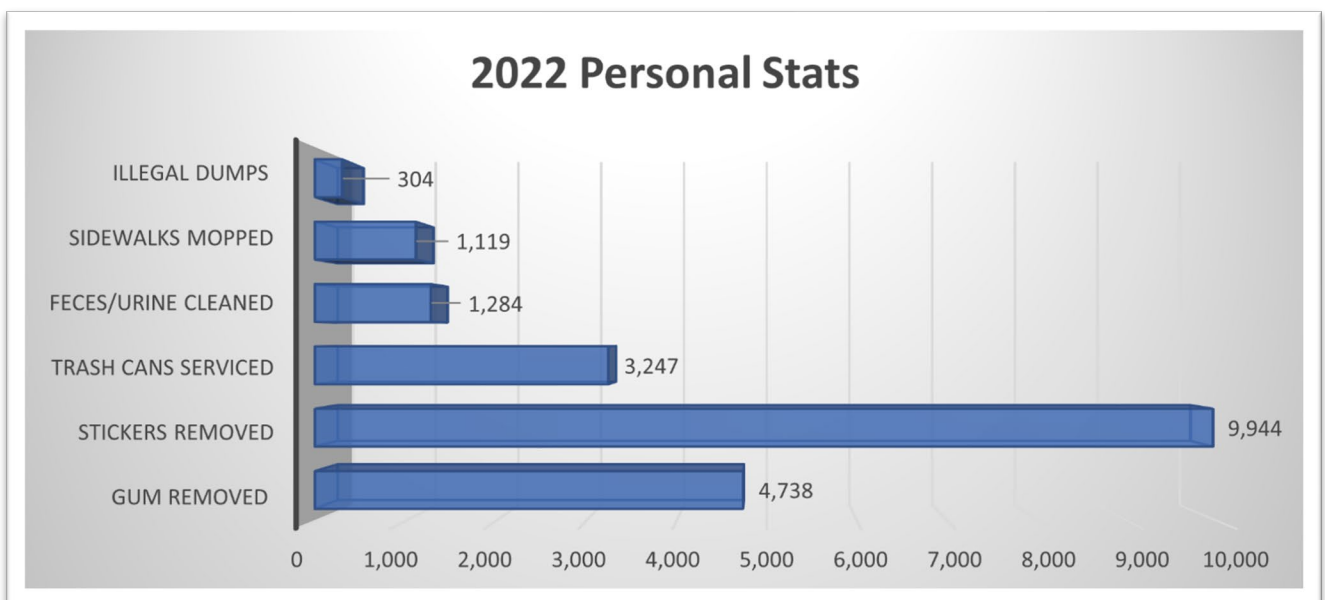

Happy to report that in December 2022, we received 720 ticket requests for Clean & Safe Services through our new Clean & Safe App. 64% of those calls were security requests totaling 459 for the month. Our security average response time is currently 1hr and 28min. We are working on minimizing that response time to 1hr or less. The Clean & Safe App continues to be the easiest and fastest way to report any security-related issues, as our team receives the request in real time and can address it as soon as they become available. Feel free to download the app as it is live, free, and available on any apple or play store.



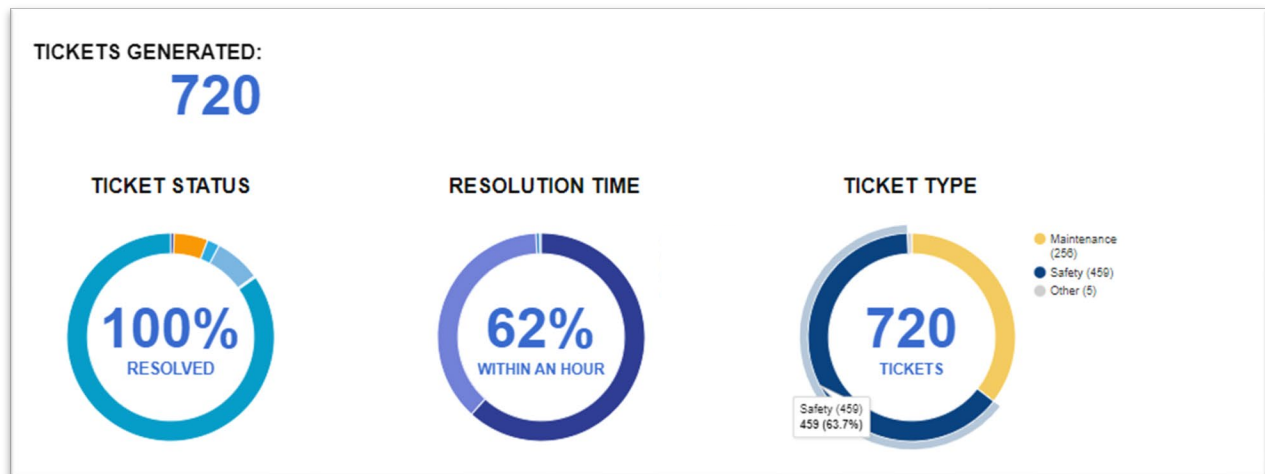

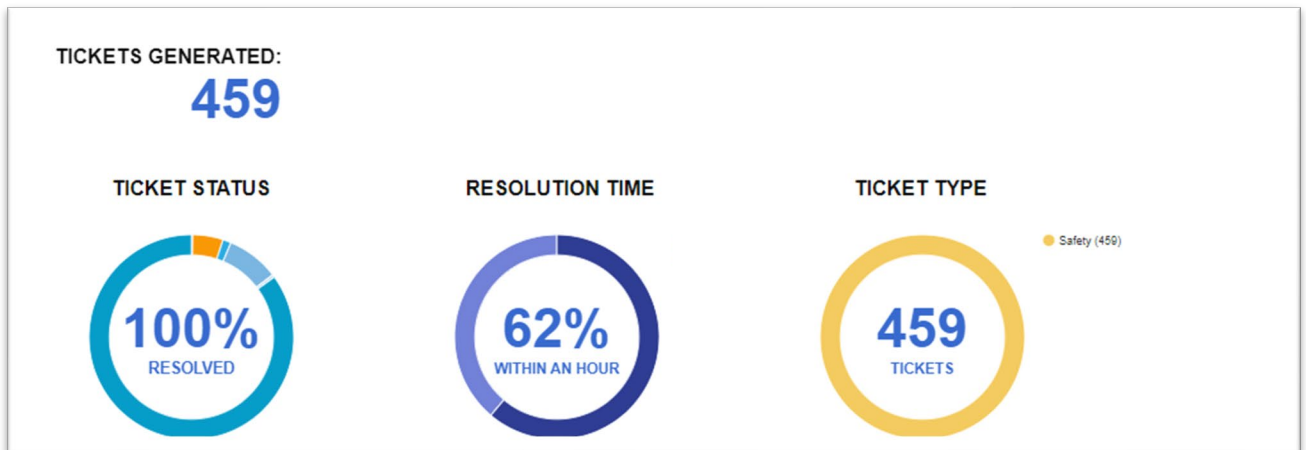

A Journey to Health

Our staff first met Randy on the 2nd street bridge. While engaging at first, he was standoffish when we offered shelter options. We started faithfully going to the bridge every morning and checking in on people there. Randy didn't want to leave his family on the bridge.

Slowly, we started getting others from the bridge into shelters or housing, and Randy became more interested. A few weeks ago, Randy got hit by a car and went to the hospital. The hospital wanted to get Randy the appropriate care in an assisted living facility to ensure he recovered well. Randy went one night and left because he felt too far away from his unhoused neighbors. Our DSDP Unhoused Care staff, who had spent that time building a relationship with him daily, could contact our friend at another assisted living facility that was closer and talk Randy into going back in to get the care he needed.

We gave Randy a bus pass to visit his friends on Christmas day, so he could still feel connected. To this day, he is still sheltered in the assisted living facility and doing well!
